 - vii Last exam passed certificate.
 - viii Disability certificate. (40% or more)
 - ix Admit card of examination (only for IInd year & final year students).
 - X Aapar ID creation is mandatory for seeking admission.
4. Click on the link- Admission for the session 2026-27 and register yourself there, by filling registration form.
- 5 The completed on-line form should be submitted on or before the dates decided by the institution/ HP university.
- 6 After the approval of admission form by the admission committee of the college, the selected candidates will have to submit the fees and other dues online within the specified dates, failing which your admission for any programme/courses will stand, cancelled and seat will be allotted to next person on merit.
- 7 The admission will purely be provisional, and will be cancelled at any stage, if the information submitted online is found incorrect.

General Admission Rules

- 1 Admission will be made on the recommendation of admission committee and strictly on fulfilment of eligibility conditions.
- 2 Applicant must not be more than 23 years of age as on 1.07 01-07-2026 (bars for girls). However in case of overage applicant, the Vice-Chancellor may allow a concession up to 6 months. In case of Scheduled caste/Scheduled tribe candidate, a concession of 3 years is allowed as per rules.
- 3 All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of V.C. of SPU Mandi.
- 4 All terms and conditions of the admission and fee structure can be changed or modified as per the directions of SPU Mandi.
- 5 A candidate seeking admission will be accompanied by his/her parents/guardian at the time of admission.
- 6 A student must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- 7 A candidate having a gap of one or more years in their studies will have to submit an undertaking explaining the reasons.
- 8 Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of H.P. bonafide certificate to avail themselves of fee concession (tuition fee only).
- 9 Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate.
- 10 The admission of a student who is seeking admission to TDC II or TDC III on the basis of educational qualifications acquired from the university other than SPU shall be regularized on the basis of equivalence of syllabi as and when decided by SPU Mandi.

In case of a student who has discontinued his/her studies for one or more year, the character certificate of institution last attended must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from gazetted class- I officer or the Panchayat Pradhan of the village/illaka concerned.

Refusal of admission

- 1 A student who fails in two subjects or fails twice in a class will not be admitted to that class. However, if he/she opts to change the faculty, he or she may be admitted in the 1st year of the changed new faculty, if otherwise eligible.
- 2 A candidate expelled by any college/university or found involved in indisciplinary activities in the preceding year (s) will not be admitted in the college.
- 3 A candidate having a stay of more than 4 years at any college will not be admitted.
- 4 The students failed or having a re-appear from other institutions will not be admitted in the college.
- 5 As there is no provision of compartment in the National Open School New Delhi rules, therefore a candidate failing in any one or more than one subject out of five, is not eligible for admission. Only pass candidates of NIOS and SOS (State Open School, Dharamshala) will be admitted if otherwise eligible.
- 6 Any candidate who has not appeared/passed in English as a subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission in BA-I.
- 7 A candidate who has passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Samelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
- 8 If a student gets admission by furnishing incorrect information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled on detection of such fault by the college/university.
- 9 In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
- 10 The Principal reserves the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student without assigning any reason (s) or explanations if situation warrants so.

- Note :**
- 1 Guardian means only blood relative/legal guardian.
 - 2 If a student does not deposit fees on the stipulated date (s) shown on the notice board, admission will be deemed as cancelled.
 - 3 The Character certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior to the date of admission.
 - 4 A student seeking admission from board/university other than SPU will have to produce photocopy of his/her migration certificate.
 - 5 Undertaking, wherever applicable.

Introduction to the Implementation of New Education Policy in a Phased Manner.

Keeping in view of NEP's recommendations, the UGC has revised the Choice Based Credit System and developed the students centric Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate programs. The framework reflects the NEP's recommendations such as restructured degree programs, multiple entry and exit, flexible degree options, with single major, double major, multi and interdisciplinary choices and a curriculum built with employability skills in addition to academic subjects.

Chief Principles of NEP-

- 1) Extensive use of technology
- 2) Respect for diversity and local context
- 3) Equity and inclusion
- 4) Rootedness and pride in India and its rich culture
- 5) Environmental education
- 6) Value based education
- 7) Community service programs
- 8) Internships with local industry & artists etc.
- 9) Research internships
- 10) Adoption of credit based courses through SWAYAM

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Degrees

-

- 1) UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study.
- 2) A UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study.
- 3) A bachelor's degree after 3 years (6 semesters) program of study.
- 4) A 4 year bachelor's degree (honours) after 8 semesters program of study. If the student completes the rigorous research project in their major areas of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree (honours with research).
- 5) The 4 year bachelor's degree program is considered preferred adoption since it would provide the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multi disciplinary education, in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the students.

Mandatory undertaking

It is mandatory for all the students and their parents/guardians to fill up the anti-ragging undertaking on line on the UGC website (antiragging.in or www.amanmovement.org) and submit a print copy to the admission committee during admission.

Students are also supposed to fill declaration regarding no use of drugs.

Eligibility for admission

- 1 For admission : a pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the H.P. University.
 - i) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc./B.C.A. programme.
 - ii) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. and BBA programme.
 - iii) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Mathematics as one of the subject shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc./B.C.A. Programme.
 - iv) A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course, can get admission in the 1st year of 'Three Year Degree' Course of B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. spread in a total of three years if he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions as given below :

2 **The minimum percentage for admission in various classes is as under :-**

B.A.-1 year : 33% (however, a student can opt for Mathematics in B.A. 1st year only if he/she has studied it in 10+2 and has obtained 45% marks in Mathematics or 45% marks in aggregate).

B.Com.-I : 45% (however it is 40% for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream and for girl candidates it is 33%).

B.Sc.-I : 45% (a relaxation of 5% of marks is given to SC/ST candidates). For determining the percentage 0.5 and above shall be considered as one.

- 3 A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc.-I year must have studied Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Mathematics and English at 10+2 level.
- 4 A candidate seeking admission to B.Com.-I year must have studied Commerce/ Mathematics /Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level.
- 5 A candidate who has not appeared/passed English as subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission to B.A.-I year.
- 6 A candidate having passed 10+2 examination in four subjects (including English as one of the compulsory subjects) from any Indian University/ Board recognized by law can seek admission.
- 7 Admission is open to an applicant who has any degree

from a foreign university (recognized by AIU (All India Universities) or the H.P. University Shimla).

- 8 If a candidate is placed under compartment in 10+2 or in an equivalent examination, he/she will not be allowed to take admission.
- 9 A student who has passed 10+2 from vocational stream or computers will be given admission in B.A./B.Com.-I year only.
- 10 A student with result R.L. / R.L. (U.M.C.)/C.S. will not be given admission in the college.
- 11 Roster system will be followed for admission in 1st year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. and M.A.
- 12 First merit list of candidates along with waiting list (those who applied for admission in a particular DSE-I subject) will be displayed on the college website and he/she has to deposit admission fee within the given particular date & time.

Important

If a candidate fails to deposit admission fee within a stipulated date and time, he/she will not be considered as admitted in his/her opted DSE-I subject. Also his/her candidature on preparation of second merit list (in case of vacancy) shall stand cancelled and candidate in waiting list will be considered for admission on the fulfillment of above conditions.

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP -2020 WILL BE IMPLEMENTED AS PER THE DIRECTIONS OF SPU/GOVT. OF HIMACHAL PRADESH FOR 1ST & 2ND SEMESTER**Programmes under NEP–2020**

Under the National Education Policy (NEP`C2020), students are offered two types of undergraduate degree options: a Single Course Major Degree, where a student specializes in one major discipline, and a Multidisciplinary Degree, which allows students to study subjects from different disciplines for a broader and holistic learning experience. The NEP framework emphasizes flexibility, skill development, academic mobility, and student-centric education.

a) B.A. (Arts) Multidisciplinary Degree/Single Core Discipline, (Major)

b) B.Sc. (Science) Multidisciplinary Degree/Single Core Discipline, (Major)

c) B.Com. (Commerce) BCA, BBA, and PGDCA Interdisciplinary Degree/Single Core Discipline, (Major)

1. Courses in Programmes

The Undergraduate Programmes under National Education Policy (NEP`C2020) comprise the following categories of courses:

1.1 Discipline Specific Courses (DSC)

A course which shall be studied by a student as a core requirement of the Major discipline is termed as a Discipline Specific Course. These courses provide foundational and conceptual understanding in the chosen discipline and constitute the primary component of the programme.

1.2 Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)

Elective courses offered under the Major discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective Courses. These courses provide advanced knowledge, specialization, and wider exposure in the discipline concerned.

1.3 Minor Courses (MC)

Minor Courses are offered to provide students exposure to another discipline apart from the Major subject. The purpose of Minor Courses is to promote multidisciplinary learning and broaden academic perspectives. One of the Major courses offered by the Department shall be treated as a Minor for students of other departments. The department may also offer a separate course or repeat the same course(s) as a Minor for students of other departments.

1.4 Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC)

Multidisciplinary Courses are intended to provide knowledge beyond the Major and Minor disciplines chosen by the student. Students may choose MDCs from a broad pool of disciplines offered by the institution. A student cannot opt for an MDC catering to their Core Courses (Major and Minor).

1.5. Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs)

Ability Enhancement Courses are designed to improve language proficiency and communication skills. Ability Enhancement Courses include English, Hindi, and Sanskrit.

1.6. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses are value-based and skill-oriented courses designed to provide practical exposure, competencies, vocational skills, hands-on training, field work, internships, and employability enhancement. Students may choose SEC according to their Core and Minor courses.

1.7. Value Added Courses (VAC)

Value Added Courses are intended to inculcate moral values, ethics, constitutional responsibilities, Indian knowledge traditions, gender sensitivity, and life skills among students. Students will student Environment education as VAC.

KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER

- The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
- In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
- At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
- Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester. The
- DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
- A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
- MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor disciplines/subjects.
- AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
- A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
- I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
- To pursue an Honours & Honours with research in the 4th year, students will have to successfully complete 3-year UG Degree and choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
- A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
- One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
- Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
- Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline.
- The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

1 Courses in Programmes

The UG (CBCS) programmes in the college, affiliated to the HPU comprise the following categories of courses :

- a) Core courses
- b) Elective courses
- c) Enhancement courses

1 Core Course : A course which should compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement is termed as Core course. Number of papers is to offer the students an option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.

3 Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs) :

The Ability Enhancement (AE) courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are- (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Modern Indian Languages communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) :

Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (for regular courses) :

These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based

core papers and for a General programme in Arts, (B.A.) Commerce (B.Com.) and Science (B.Sc.) shall have 12 core courses each. Besides there will be 2 papers each of English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com. as compulsory courses. The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.

2 Elective Course : Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skills is called an Elective course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 each for regular courses) :

Elective courses offered under the Main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 courses each for B.A/B.Com. regular courses) :

An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category or skill based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on training fieldwork.

The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life skills in hand-on modes to increase their employability.

3.3 An undergraduate degree in Science discipline may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective paper based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.

4 An undergraduate degree in Humanities/Social Sciences/Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core paper each in English/Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and 2 papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.

SELF-FINANCING COURSES

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) & Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) are being run by the college under Self-Financing Scheme.

BBA, BCA & PGDCA:

The duration of BBA & BCA course is of three years and it is a semester based programme spread over six semesters. Duration of PGDCA is of one year and it is spread over two semesters.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS:

a. BBA Plus two examinations under 10+2 system or examination equivalent there to of a Board / University established by law in India, with 45% Marks (40% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Candidates).

b. BCA : Plus two examination under 10+2 system or

examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India, with 40% Marks (35% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe Candidates)

c. PGDCA : Bachelor degree in any discipline with at least 50% Marks (45% marks in case of Scheduled Caste /Scheduled Tribe candidates) from a university established by law in India

OR

Any examination of a university/ Board/ College or School in an equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalence committee with 50% marks (45% in case of SC/ST candidates)

Basis of Admission to BBA/BCA/PGDCA

Admissions shall be made on the basis of Entrance test to be conducted by SPU and vacant seats, if any, will be filled by on the merit basis.

**Non-sub-seized/payment seats
(BBA, BCA & PGDCA) :**

There will not be any written Test for Non-subsidized category. The final selection to these seats will be based on merit subject to minimum eligibility conditions laid by SPU.

Note:

1. Only the eligible candidates shall be admitted to the courses subject to availability of seats.
2. The candidates shall compete in their respective categories only.
3. Attendance in regular classes should be more than 75% of the total lectures delivered.
4. There will be a compulsory industrial tour for the student's of 3rd year of BBA.

Application form and fee:

Application form should be filled online and subsequently fee should also be submitted online along with relevant documents.

1. Separate application form along with counselling fees of Rs.300/- (Rs.200/- in case of SC/ST/Antodaya/IRDP/BPL candidates) for subsidized and non-subsidized seats and fee should be deposited in

2. Attested copy of certificate of Matriculation and Plus Two with the conversion formula of grades in percentage, whatever applicable, with relevant testimonial for BBA and BCA.

3. Along with these certificates attested copy of graduation certificate is also required for PGDCA.

4. Proof of the date of birth (Matriculation certificate).

5. Certificate in original from appropriate authority.

- i) Certificate of SC/ST/Antodaya /IRDP/BPL.
- ii) Bonafide Himachali.
- iii) Certificate of differently abled.

6. House Examination and Library Registration Card.

7. Two self-addressed envelopes of size 28x23 cm bearing stamps of Rs. 5/- India and in case of foreign addressee stamps of required amount should be affixed by the applicant.

Note: 1. The above fees and funds are subject to change as per SPU/HP GOVT Instructions.

2. Fee and funds once deposited shall not be refunded in any case.

Reservation Rules (General)

Admission to the courses except for self-financing payment seats shall be subject to the following Conditions:-

1. 10%, 15% & 7.5% seats shall be reserved for General, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from HP Board of School Education, or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or from HPU or HP Krishi Vishwavidyalaya or Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry.

2. The remaining 67.5% shall be filled as under:

i. 25% seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examinations.

ii. 75% of the seats out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from HP Board of School Education or any other School located within the territorial jurisdictions of the Himachal Pradesh, or from HPU or HP Krishi Vishwavidyalaya or Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of the Horticulture and Forestry subject to the following

- a. 5% of the seats shall be reserved for candidates outstanding in cultural activities.
- b. 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding sports persons.
- c. 5% of the seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.

The minimum eligibility condition for admission to the courses in case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility conditions for the other students.

The roster of admission showing reservation to various categories shall be used as per the rules of Himachal Pradesh University Shimla/Sardar Patel University Mandi.

Age Limit: BBA/BCA & PGDCA

The maximum age limit in BCA course is 21 years for boys, 23 years for girls and 24 years for SC/ST candidates. The maximum age limit for BBA course is 22 years and for PGDCA is 26 years as on 01-07-2025. However, in case of candidates belonging to scheduled castes / scheduled tribes, there will be relaxation of three years. The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing upto a maximum of six months.

Examination and Evaluation System

Old system (For students seeking admission in 2nd and 3rd year)

Annual system of examination commenced from the academic session 2018-2019. This system is, now, applicable only for the 2nd year and 3rd year of UG program across all streams. The total credits for the pass course at UG level is 132 and for honour course at UG level is 148.

New System (For students seeking admission in first semester)

From the current academic session 2026-27, the UG programs across all streams under NEP have been introduced. Now the total credits for the pass course at UG level is 128 and for honours degree (with or without research) is 168. A student will be awarded undergraduate certificate after securing 44 credits in semester I and II. After securing 86 credits, the student will be awarded undergraduate diploma; after securing 128 credits student will be awarded bachelor degree in the field of study/discipline; and after securing 168 credits student will be awarded bachelor degree (Hons/ Hons with Research) on the completion of VIII semester.

CCA and Term

End examinations will be 70% in theory and 30% in CCA for Arts and Commerce where practicals are not involved. For Sciences and the subjects/courses where practicals are involved, it will be 50% in theory, 20% in practicals and 30% in CCA. Accountings for 30% of the final grade that the students get in a course.

Annual Examination

Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the students get in a course.

i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment CAA

This would have the following components:

Classroom attendance

Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorial/ Practical

A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual/ end semester examination.

- Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for examination in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reasons for absence to the authorised functionaries.
- Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for examination in a prescribe form accompanied by a medical certificate from a government hospital.
- Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificates from the concerned college authorities.
- Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for Co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:

a) Classroom Attendance Incentive:

b) House test/ Class test/ Mid-term test:

House test and class test will be held in December 2026.

• **The pattern of tests for Ist and 2nd Semester under NEP will be as under:**

- i) DSC, DSE, and MC - Class test =15 marks
- ii) MDC & SEC - Class test =10 marks
- iii) AEC and VAC Class test = 10 marks

House test and class test will be held after completion of 50% of the syllabus.

c) Seminar/ Assignment/ Term paper (all UG classes)

10 marks of the CCA will be awarded by the subject teachers (each paper) on the basis of seminar/ assignment and term paper.

d) Annual examination/ End Semester Examination

The remaining grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of Annual/ End Semester exams that will be for three hours covering the whole syllabus of the course. The annual examination of the BA/ B.Com. / B.Sc.II and III year will be held in March 2027.

End Semester Examination of Ist Sem. will be held in November 2026 and End Semester Examination of 2nd Semester will be held in April 2027.

Minimum pass marks will be 40% in aggregate. However, 35% each in Internal Assessment and final examination will be compulsory. For practicals, 40% pass marks will be compulsory and if a candidate fails to obtain 40% marks in practicals, he/ she will be treated as fail in that subject. A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/ papers will be given compartment in that subject(s)/ paper (s) and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/she will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at the annual stage) available to him/her to clear the compartment. He/she will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all papers/ courses within 5 years(**in case of semester system, 07 years**) from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/ papers will be treated as fail in that year/semester and has to repeat the entire year/semester.

The success of a candidate will be classified on the combined results of the I, II and III year examination as follows:

First Division- 60% marks or more in aggregate

second division- 50% marks but less than 60%.

Third division- less than 50%

Revaluation shall be applicable as per provision of Sardar Patel University Mandi for yearly and Semester system.

Determining SGPA and CGPA, Division and Merit position for Medals etc.

For each student the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and the cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be determined by the COE office of the SPU as follows:

$$\text{GPA or CGPA} = \frac{\sum C_i G_i}{\sum C_i}$$

Where 'i' is summed over the number of courses studied in the current semester. GPA or CGPA = $\frac{\sum C_i G_i}{\sum C_i}$. Where (i) here is summed over the number of courses studied in the past semesters as well as current semester 'Ci' is the credit earned for course and 'Gi' is the grade.

At the completion of the UG program the CGPA will be determined for the following three parts separately:

1. Part I -Ability Enhancement Courses.
2. Part II Skill Enhancement Courses.
3. Part III Core Courses and Elective Courses.

In each of the parts, the candidate will be categorized as below:

GUIDLINES AND ADMISSION RULES FOR MASTER'S DEGREE (M.A.)

The college offers Post-graduate courses in the subjects of English and Economics. The number of seats in each subject (per semester) are 20 and 40 respectively.

General Rules

- 1 An applicant who is placed in compartment in B.A./B.Com./B.Sc.III examination is not eligible for admission to the Master's Degree in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment.
- 2 A student who has attained the age of 26 years for boys & 28 years for girls as on **1st July, 2026** (upper age limit is raised to 29 years for ST/SC candidates). The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation upto a maximum period of 6 months for reasons to be recorded in writing. However, the age bar shall not apply in the case of candidates in service nominated by the government of H.P.
- 3 A candidate who fails in 1st semster may be permitted to join 2nd semester but he/she shall not be permitted to proceed from 1st semester to 3rd semester without appearing in the examination.
- 4 At the time of 1st semester examination, the candidate may appear along with the 2nd semester papers (if the university rules otherwise permit), but the student shall not be permitted to proceed from 3rd semester to the 4th semester without appearing in the examination.
- 5 The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional

and shall be confirmed only when he/she produces the migration certificate and character certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.

- 6 The admission will be made purely on merit except where otherwise mentioned, subject to the number of seats available and the reservation as per university rules/roster as per the HPU Letter no.-1- 58/2016 HPU (DS) for admission in PG Classes. HPU Shimla will conduct centralized entrance test. After declaration of the result, students will have to apply accordingly in the college of their choice.
- 7 Preference in the admission will be given to candidates who have appeared in entrance tests of M.A. Economics and English conducted by H.P. university. In case of vacancy, college will conduct an entrance test and eligible candidates will be offered admission. If eligible candidates do not seek admission on the stipulated dates, candidates from waiting list will be called for the admission.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS**M.A.**

Candidates who have passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com /B.Sc. (Agri), B.Sc. (Home Science), B.Sc. (Engg.), M.B.B.S./B.A.M.S./G.A.M.S./B.Pharma /B.T. or B.Ed./ B.Lib. Sc./Vashista Degree of a university established by law in India with at least second division (50% marks) in aggregate or 45% marks or Honours in the subject in which admission to M.A. class is sought, are eligible. Relaxation of 5% marks in minimum eligibility to admission is given to the SC/ST candidates.

Fine and Penalties

- 1
 - a) Every student must pay the dues on the dates notified from time to time.
 - b) A student have to pay the dues for 12 months at the time of admission.
 - c) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Rs. 1/- per day. However of non payment of dues within 30 days, the name of student will be struck off the college rolls.
 - d) Registration fee will not be charged from the student migrating from any other college if he/she is already registered with H.P. University, Shimla. The other funds will have to be paid from the month of joining this institution except for tuition fee already paid.
- 2 The name of a student will be struck off the college-rolls if he/she remains absent in any subject without a n y l e a v e for 10 days.* If name of a student is struck off in one class, automatically his/her name will be struck off in other classes also. *Such a student will have to seek re-admission within 10 days and get his/her name registered with the subject teachers in the attendance register.
- 3 Every student will have to procure no-dues certificates from the library/N.C.C./N.S.S./Sports/Fee-clerk/ Science laboratories if he/she wants to leave the college.
- 4 The Principal can expel a student from the college if he/she is found guilty of misconduct.
- 5 The library security will lapse if a student does not apply for refund within one year after leaving the college.
- 6 Re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- and 200/- will be charged for 1st and 2nd time within 10 days from the date name is struck off. The admission of a candidate should stand cancelled if his/her name is struck off the third time.

Leave Rules for Students

- 1 A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the Principal but the application should be signed by the parent/guardian and duly recommended by the class teacher (tutor).
- 2 Leave up to five days shall be granted by class teacher (tutor) and leave exceeding five days will be granted by the Principal.
- 3 Leave on account of illness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- 4 In case of medical leave for a period of 6 days or more, the applicant must produce a medical certificate.

IMPORTANT :

Students participating in inter-college competitions should note that the practice/rehearsal timing should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities do not substitute academics/studies.

Library rules

Every student will be issued an Identity card. Since I-card is the only medium to identify/ differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always carry it with him/her and must produce it whenever required (during all working days, examinations (s) and college function (s) etc.) otherwise he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished

accordingly. If the I-card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such a request.

Rs. 20/- are to be deposited for a duplicate Identity card.

- 1 The college library is sufficiently equipped and has approx. 12000 books on the shelves. It subscribes 10 newspapers, 20 magazines and journals regularly. The library has different sections for text-books and reference-books.
- 2 Generally two books are issued for 15 days but the Librarian has the right to recall the books.
- 3 Reference-books are not issued.
- 4 In case of loss of a book, the student will have to replace the book or pay fine in addition to the current price of the book with the special permission of the Principal.
- 5 Books are issued only on the production of Identity-card.
- 6 Books will not be renewed more than twice.
- 7 Class-wise schedule of issuing and returning the books will be notified separately.
- 8 If the books are not returned within specific period, a fine of 1/- per book, per day will be charged.

- 9 **Book Bank Facility :**
The college has a well established book bank to help poor and meritorious students.
- 10 Students can access e-resources through INFLIBNET.
- 11 Faculty and students can register themselves on online portal <https://indl.iltkgp.ac.in> to become member of national Digital Library and can read or download 6.8 million books free of charge.

4 Dr. Ambedkar Post-Matric Scholarship for Economically Backward Classes :

Under this scheme, all students belonging to general category (other than SC/ST and OBC) whose parents total income from all sources in case of the employed and unemployed candidate, shall not exceed Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum, are eligible for full scholarship for all courses, provided they are pursuing their studies in govt. institutions.

5 Merit cum means scholarship scheme for students belonging to minority communities

This scholarship is given to pursue degree /post-graduate degree/professional courses from recognized institution, to the students belonging to the minority groups (Muslim-37, Sikh-22, Christian-2, Buddhist-24, Total = 85 students). The annual income of the parents/guardian of the beneficiary should not exceed Rs. 2.50 Lacs, from all sources

and students should not have less than 50% marks. Students under this scheme need to apply online at <http://www.scholarships.gov.in>

6 Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme to students belonging to minority communities

This scholarship will be conferred from XI to Ph.D. level in govt./recognized private schools /colleges/institutes including technical/vocational courses, to the students belonging to the minority communities (Muslim-309, Sikh-187, Christian -20, Buddhist-196, Jain-4, Parsi-2, Total=718 students). The annual income of the parent or guardian of the beneficiary should not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/- from all sources and student should not have less than 50% marks in the previous final examination. A student must pass the examination from govt./govt. aided institutions. Students under this scheme need to apply online at <http://www.scholarships.gov.in>

7 Maulana Azad National Scholarship Scheme for Meritorious Girl students belonging to minorities

This scholarship will be granted from XI to Ph.D. level in govt./recognized/private schools /colleges/institutes including technical/vocational courses, to the students belonging to the minority communities (Muslim-309, Sikh-187, Christian -20, Buddhist-196, Jain-4, Parsi-2, Total=718 students). The annual income of the parent or guardian of the beneficiary should not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/- from all sources and student should not have less than 50% marks in the previous final examination. A student must pass the examination from govt./govt. aided institutions. Students under this scheme need to apply online at <http://www.scholarships.gov.in>

8 Scholarship to disabled students

Under this scheme, 1000 scholarships are provided to differently abled students for degree and Post-graduate level, professional and technical courses from recognized institution. Yearly income of beneficiary's/parent/guardian should not be more than 3,00,000/-p.a. from all sources.

State Sponsored Schemes

1 Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatervriti Yojana for Post +2 students

The scholarship under this scheme shall be awarded to 10 male toppers each from the list of 10+2 Arts, Science and Commerce of the H.P. Board of School Education Dharmshala and to 10 toppers (both male & female) from the merit lists of B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com. of HPU Shimla, provided they join any academic/professional stream. The rate of scholarship is Rs. 10,000/- p.a., per student. This scholarship scheme will be renewed every year to the same student till he/she completes degree/ course with at least 55% marks.

2 Kalpana Chawla Chhatravriti Yojana

Under this scheme, top 2000 meritorious girl students of 10+2 (Science/Arts/Commerce) are awarded Rs. 15000/- per student p.a. This scholarship will renewed till completion of degree/diploma/certificate course, provided there is no failure.

3 Maharishi Balmiki Chhatterviriti Yojana

The scholarship under this scheme is given to the bonafide Himachali girl students belonging to Balmiki families, engaged in unclean occupation beyond matric to college level for studies from any govt./private recognized school/college situated with in Himachal Pradesh. Rs. 9,000/- p.a., per student is given under this scheme.

4 IRDP Scholarship Scheme

Students belonging to IRDP families and studying in 9th to university level are eligible for this scholarship provided they are pursuing their studies in govt./govt. aided institution in H.P. Rs. 12,000/- p.a., per student is given under this scheme.

5 Mukhya Mantri Gyandeep Yojana

This is new Mukhya Mantri Gyandeep Yojana sponsored by state govt. for all those students who are bonafide of Himachal Pradesh pursuing professional/technical course/higher education course from recognized institution in India. Under this scheme, interest subsidy is admissible from any bank on education loan availed up to the maximum of Rs. 10 lacs. Interest subsidy to the extent of 4% p.a. on education loan will allowed. Students should apply through any bank directly to get benefit from this scheme.

Indira Gandhi National Open University

The college has a well-established study centre of IGNOU. It serves the education aspirations of about 1.5 million students in India and 35 countries abroad through 11 schools of studies and an elaborate network of 58 regional centres. The degrees of IGNOU are equivalent to any other recognised university in the country. The courses which are activated in this study centre are M.A., B.A., B.Com. BTS, DTS, CES, CIC, BPP etc. Prospectus for all other programmes of IGNOU are also available with the Co-ordinator of the study centre. Regular students of the college can also take admission in diploma and certificate courses in the IGNOU along with their regular studies to plan their future accordingly.

NSS, NCC, Rovers & Rangers and Red-Ribbon Club

To inculcate the qualities of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youth, following units are being run in the college :

NSS

The motto of NSS is "Not Me but You." The objective of NSS is to understand the community in which we work. It promotes national integration and sense of social responsibility. It organises activities of social service and welfare. One day and 7 day special camps are organized during every academic session. The college has two N.S.S. units each comprising of 100 volunteers. The enrolment is made by selection keeping in view the interest of students in social service.

NCC

Unity and Discipline' is the motto of N.C.C. and therefore it aims at developing character, good fellowship, discipline, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service among youth. It also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces. The college has N.C.C. Senior Division Boys & Girls (Army wing Cop. 2nd) under the Command of 2 H.P. Bn. N.C.C. Mandi with 80 cadets. The students opting for NCC, must be medically fit. The enrolment will depend on availability of vacancies.

Rovers & Rangers is a world wide association of well disciplined volunteers. It has two wings, one for girls (rangers) and one for boys (rovers). The students who obtain a 'NIPUN' certificate are eligible for 2% marks weightage while seeking employment. Each wing has 24 seats. Rovers & Rangers is based on the principles - 'duty to God, duty to others and duty to self'. Enrolment in these wings start after admission in the college.

Red Ribbon Club

ANTI-RAGGING/DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the education institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, vide its orders dated 4th May, 2007 and 11th Feb., 2009 has directed as hereunder

- 1 Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- 2 Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- 3 Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- 4 Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- 5 Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- 6 Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- 7 Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it : sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- 8 Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- 9 Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher.
- 10 Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including trans gender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic back ground.
